We are also thrilled to host our current Australian Children's Laureate, the wonderful **Morris Gleitzman**, who will be based on the stand.







Australian Children's Laureate







Morris Gleitzman is a bestselling Australian children's author. He has written more than 40 books exploring serious and sometimes confronting subjects in funny and unexpected ways. His first success was Two Weeks with the Queen, an international bestseller. These days he's probably best known for the Once series, exploring the lives of children in wartime and beyond. His most recent book is Help Around The House - the story of a boy who offers help and advice to Australia's Members of Parliament with mixed results. Morris's books have been published in about twenty countries.

Morris has spent his first year as Australian Children's Laureate roaming the land engaging young readers in a celebration of stories and all the precious things they get from them. He has also spent a lot of time encouraging adults to think more deeply about the transformative gualities of good stories and the ways they equip young people for future challenges. Morris has spoken widely at conferences, festivals, schools, on television and radio, and in at least one Parliament House, and was the 2018 Ambassador for Australia's Reading Hour. He has recently been featured on an Australia Post stamp.

Morris feels the more we read, the more we develop our creativity, empathy, bravery, honesty, curiosity, resilience, cheekiness, emotional intelligence, manipulation-spotting ability and problem-solving skills almost without realising it. He's happy to discuss this bold claim in any of the bars of Bologna, a process he assumes is otherwise known as the International Laureate Summit.

'I aim to be not just a laureate, but also an ambassador. An emissary from the place where young imaginations draw strength from stories and grow and engage and become our best hope for the future.'

The Australian Children's Laureate Foundation [ACLF], Morris and illustrator Andrew Weldon have put together a calendar poster covering the various themes and ideas Morris is exploring as laureate.




The Honeyman and the Hunter Neil Grant
